

Scholastic Reading Club: Class Novels...

We will use the novel, Freak the Mighty starting next week. Each student should have an e-copy on their iPad or a paper copy from limitless libraries to use in class. If a copy is needed, please let Mr. P know.

IXL + iReady Reminders...

Daily assigned IXL skills must be completed during the assigned week. Just like putting your name on your paper, a student **MUST** be logged in to their assigned class IXL account. A student must make a Smart Score of



91% on each assigned IXL skill. If after 11 minutes, that score has not been reached, he/she may end practice on that skill. iReady lessons assigned by Mr. P will usually occur on Mondays. Students should finish the video lesson as well as the practice exercises that follow. If the resulting score is below 80%, students should make a second attempt.

WLR + WMR...

Students receive a Weekly Language Review (WLR) and Weekly Math Review (WMR) each Monday. Both should be completed throughout the week and are due on Thursday. On Fridays, a WLR quiz covering skills similar to the ones on the weekly sheet will be given. In math, the WMR quiz will be the exact problems from that week's sheet. These are both summative grades and there is not an opportunity to revisit these grades since students have all week to receive any assistance on the WLR and WMR sheets.
